

PROGRAM HANDBOOK

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Section I General Information

Forward: This Handbook is designed to familiarize you with the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program, and provide you with information about policies and requirements for all participants (players, parents, coaches, etc.). Both players and parents should read this handbook and have a thorough understanding of what is expected and be prepared to comply with its provisions.

No handbook can anticipate every circumstance or question, but the intention of this handbook is to provide a framework of expectations for a program that is striving for excellence in all we do (Col 3:23). It may be necessary from time to time for those charged with leadership of the program (Athletic Director, Board Members, and Coaches) to make tough decisions in enforcing or interpreting what follows. Please understand that this is done with the intention of "Making every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." (Eph. 4:3).

The Lincoln Eagles Board reserves the right to revise or rescind any policy or portion of the handbook as it deems appropriate. Players and parents will be notified of any impactful in-season changes to the handbook as soon as possible. Updated copies of the handbook will be provided at the beginning of each season with descriptions of any significant changes.

Vision, Mission, & Values Statements

Clearly identifying and defining your purpose (Vision), how you will accomplish that purpose (Mission), and the values that guide that pursuit is essential to actually accomplishing what you set out to do. The Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program Defines each of these as follows:

Vision: Developing Godly Character through the Pursuit of Excellence in Basketball. (Col. 3:23)

<u>Mission</u>: We will use the adversity that comes when we play the game and give our best as a tool for building a character foundational to a life that honors God. (Rom. 5:3-5)

Values:

- 1) We value EXCELLENCE. Giving our very best no matter the circumstances, no matter our feelings, no matter what anyone one else says, and no matter if anyone else is watching, is what God expects of us all. (Col. 3:23)
- 2) We value IMPROVEMENT. The simple goal to "Get Better" every day as players and as people is something that anyone can achieve. (Proverbs 4:18)
- 3) We value CHARACTER. On and off the court, our character is a reflection of what God has done in our hearts, how we observe His commands, and ultimately how we represent Him to a lost and dying world. (Romans 5:3-5)
- We value RELATIONSHIP. God designed us for relationship because we are truly better together. Our awareness of this shows in how we treat others (Teammates, Coaches, Officials, Other Teams) and humble ourselves. (Proverbs 27:17)
- 5) We value FAMILY. God has ordained the nuclear family and His family the Church as the primary way to meet our needs as people. As a Program we will respect this, while also striving to create our own "family" environment/experience for all participants. (Ephesians 3:14-21)

Eligibility: We welcome players from Lincoln and the surrounding areas who are homeschooled for at least 51% of their classes over the course of the school year. Please contact the Athletic Director if you have any specific questions about your child's eligibility.

Coaching Philosophy: The desire of the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program is to develop young men and women first in character and life skills, and second in athletics. Coaching technique will vary some from coach to coach, as well as with different ages and team levels. Our desire is certainly to win games, but more importantly we want our players to improve and develop their character and their skills. Junior High teams will see coaches rotate players in and out of the game in order to develop players as they mature, their skill develops, and to the player's comfort level. At the Varsity level the coaches will play the best players, as determined by the coaches, in order to win games. These decisions are the responsibility of each team's coaches and are based on various factors, including player attendance at practices/games, attitude/effort at practices/games, cohesiveness with other players, etc. If players have questions about playing time, they should ask their coach. If there is a more serious issue please contact the Athletic Director or a member of the Board. Our coaches are held to a high standard by the Lincoln Eagles Board, and are provided "Coaching Guidelines" which are the program's expectations. These are available for your review upon request.

Team Assignment: Players are assigned to teams first based on age, then by ability, and coach's assessment, and lastly by parent or player preference. The assignment continues at the coach's discretion throughout the season. Junior High and younger players will remain with their teams through 8th grade (or 9th grade if still eligible, see "Age/Date cutoff below") however older junior high players may be asked to play up as necessary for development. Coaches may request a player to move to a different/higher team or play for more than one team only after discussion with the player's parents and the coaches for all teams involved. Our program is willing to consider placement of players on teams to make family life and schedules easier. However, it must make sense and not be disruptive to effective practices and thus is must be approved by the team head coach.

Age/Date Cutoff for Junior High and High School Competition: There is a cutoff age and date for participation in Junior High versus High School competition. The cutoff age and date is 15, on or after September 1st. So, if a student athlete turns 15 on August 31st or before the player must play at the high school level. There is one exception to this, the Lincoln Eagles Junior High Teams participate in the Catholic League in Lincoln, and their cutoff is January 1st. So If you turn 15 before January 1st you will not be able to participate in the approximately 8 Catholic League games we play each season. September 1st is also the cutoff date for high school eligibility, except that the age is 19 instead of 15.

Team Travel: Due to the nature of home school sports, travel to for single games and tournaments is normal. In general, it is the Program's position that anytime we travel more than 90 minutes away we attempt to get multiple games for each team participating. All travel expenses for games and tournaments are the responsibility of the player and their family. Travel at the high school level is essential and will occur regularly. If this presents a problem for your family, please communicate with your coach. Travel is always at the discretion of the family. However, it should be noted that the inability to travel will very likely impact your student athlete's playing time. While traveling, the player is to be under the direct authority of their parent, or another adult assigned responsibility by the parent if they are not traveling with the team. Families have the option of not housing with the team during overnight travel if it is in their best interest and they have made proper arrangements with coaches.

However, the player should do all they can to be present for team functions (meals, meetings, film sessions, etc.).

Parental Involvement: A huge part of our success as an Eagles Basketball Program is the willingness of our families and players to help with the various duties that are essential to our administrative and on-court success. Thank you in advance for making this a priority! There are numerous responsibilities that we must have volunteers for prior to the start of our season. These include but are not limited to the following:

- <u>Team Parents</u>: A team parent is assigned for each team to help facilitate communication and coordination of schedule and inevitable last-minute changes amongst the parents and players of individual teams (VB, VG, JVB, JVDEV, JHB, JHG). In addition, having a team parent onsite at games to make sure we have all our game duty responsibilities covered is essential.
- <u>Concessions Committee</u>: Responsible for coordinating concessions for games and tournaments that we host. This includes purchasing food and supplies (reimbursed), ensuring necessary equipment is available, and making sure that we have enough volunteers. Since it is typically in close proximity, the concessions committee will also make sure someone is working the admissions table at home events.
- <u>Set up, Cleaning & Maintenance</u>: Responsible for the set-up, tear down and cleaning facilities we utilize for games/tournaments we host, and securing volunteers to do so. This also includes coordinating any duties assigned by other team tournament or game hosts. This includes sweeping courts in between games and half time, making sure bathrooms are presentable, cleaning/sweeping bleachers, collecting and removing garbage, etc.
- <u>Banquet Committee</u>: Plan the end of year banquet, including facilities, meal, decorations, etc.
- <u>Travel Coordinator</u>: Coordinate details related to travel tournaments/games including hotel accommodations, and team meals. This includes reserving blocks of hotel rooms, cancelling reservations, coordinating with restaurants or other Eagles families to provide team meals, planning any program activities.
- <u>Fundraising Coordinator</u>: Work with the Athletic Director/Board to coordinate individual and team fundraising activities. This includes investigating fundraising opportunities, communication of details and deadlines, distribution of related materials and/or merchandise, administration of sponsorships (advertising graphics, etc.), and collection of funds.
- <u>Home Tournament Committee</u>: Assist the Athletic Director with the planning, administration, and executing on our annual home tournament.

At a minimum, 1 adult from each family will be expected to fill volunteer spots during home games, and <u>hosted tournaments.</u> In general, each family should be volunteering during our home games, and hosted tournaments. It is impractical to completely track adherence to the above, and it is understood that circumstances arise which may not allow your family to help. The above is meant primarily as an easy to remember standard. As a participant in the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program have the mentality of "See a need, fill a need", which means be on the lookout for what you can do to help, even if the responsibility has not been assigned to you.

Once the volunteer schedule is set, if you have a conflict, we ask that you please find someone to trade with so your job will be covered. Please let the applicable coordinator know of that you have switched with someone. It is your responsibility to either cover your assignment or trade with someone if you are unable.

For out-of-town games and tournaments some "Game duties" are still our responsibility (book, clock, videoing, sweeping, etc.). These should be assumed by those onsite. Video duties for these games will be assumed by and/or assigned by the Team Parent.

Uniforms: To compete in games for the Lincoln Eagles each student athlete will need to purchase a current Lincoln Eagles uniform. The Lincoln Eagles want to make sure that our student athletes look their best and feel proud to represent our program. To accomplish this, we work with a local supplier to secure great looking, high quality, and cost-effective uniforms. The cost of new uniforms will be billed via the players fee invoice. Uniforms details (size and number) will be collected during the registration process. Several opportunities will be provided to players to be sized prior to the close of registration and the ordering of new uniforms for the year. Returning players will be given priority when it comes to selecting a number in the following order 1) Varsity, 2) JV, 3) Middle School/Junior High, followed by new players in the same order. If multiple players with the same priority level want the same number, it will be determined by who registered first. Transition to new uniforms will take place approximately every 3 years depending on overall wear and tear on uniforms. With that in mind, please do your very best to take excellent care of your uniforms, including making sure they are washed on a delicate washer cycle and are hung up to dry (not machine dried). If your uniform is damaged or stained in some way that makes it unpresentable, you will be required to order and pay for a new uniform.

Practices: Basketball is a team sport so it is imperative for players to be at every practice and game possible. When you make a commitment to play for a team, you make a commitment to your teammates and coaches. When you are late or miss a practice, it has a negative impact on the effectiveness of your team. If you can't be at a practice for some reason, please let your head coach know as far in advance as possible. If issues arise with attendance at practices disciplinary action will be taken (See Player Discipline in Section II). Practice location/times can change because of limits on available facilities in and around the Lincoln area. Communication via email, text, the Lincoln Eagles Facebook page, or LincolnEagles.net calendar are the best ways to stay up to date on this information.

Communication: In general, you should expect communication via e-mail from the program email account, <u>Lincoln.EaglesBasketball@gmail.com</u>. In addition, the Lincoln Eagles Facebook Page, and the LincolnEagles.com calendar will be sources of information, especially for practice and game times and locations. When items are particularly time sensitive communication through text message or phone call should be expected. In addition, Team Parents are another way to help with communication of game & practice times, extra team activities and events as well as game duty requirements specific to each team. Schedule changes are inevitable, especially in home school athletics. Please be flexible and check the website and your e-mail regularly. Decisions to cancel practice, games or other events are based on weather forecasts, or school and business closings at the time of the scheduled event. An e-mail, Facebook, and text notification of cancellation will be sent as soon as possible. It is extremely helpful for you to "like" and follow the Lincoln Eagles Facebook page, as well as like and share our posts.

Financial Accountability: We desire to keep all financial business of the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program at the highest level of Christian character and respect. An Income and Expense Report is available upon request after the end of each season on June 30th. Transparency with the finances of the program is our goal, and thus general information is available to families involved in the program upon request. However, please understand that the Athletic Director, Board Members, and Coaches are all volunteers and thus financial information is not always maintained in an immediately presentable manner. The Athletic Director/President, Treasurer, and/or Board Members should be able to speak to the finances of the program at any point and give assurances to participating families if questions related to finances arise. Participating families are expected to fulfill their financial responsibilities according to the same high standards.

Fundraising: The Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program offers several options to players to participate in fundraising opportunities. *Fundraising efforts should be completed by approximately the middle of October*. Fundraising is not obligatory, and each player can participant and offset some or all of their player fees and uniform fees by combination of the options below.

<u>Sponsorships</u>: 100% of the sponsorship amounts listed below can be applied to the costs associated with <u>Players Fees</u> and <u>Uniforms</u>. Any excess sponsorship money raised (exceeding players and uniform fees), goes directly to the Lincoln Eagles. Please have sponsors make out their checks to Lincoln Eagles Basketball. The following are tiers of sponsorship and benefits we offer to businesses:

- **Gold** (\$350+):
 - Sponsor Logo included on player shooting shirts (LIMITED TO FIRST 20)
 - Large ad in our home game program (1"x5"), on website, and Facebook page
 - Specific mention during Facebook Live Broadcasts, and by MC at Home Games
 - Additional opportunities tailored to sponsor preference including:
 - Sponsored content on our Facebook page (Content provided by sponsor, as determined to be appropriate by the LEB Athletic Director/Board)
 - Banner/Advertising displayed at all home games (Banner/Advertising provided by sponsor)
 - Other accommodations as negotiated with LEB Athletic Director/Board
- *Silver* (\$250+):
 - Large ad in our home game program (1"x5"), on website, and Facebook page
 - Specific mention during Facebook Live Broadcasts, and by MC at Home Games
- **Bronze** (\$150+):
 - Small ad (1"x2 ½") in our home program & sponsor name listed on the Lincoln Eagles website
- *Patron* (Any donation \$149 or below): Sponsor name listed in program.

<u>Selling Opportunities</u>: This is another great opportunity to raise funds to cover your player and uniform fees, or to raise money for additional costs such as hotels, gas, and meals, etc. Please have the purchaser pay you personally for all sales with cash, Venmo, or check (made out to you). Then pay the Lincoln Eagles for the cost of items you sold, and keep the difference (somewhere around 40-45%). The Lincoln Eagles coordinate with our partners and will get product back to you for delivery.

To help with fundraising efforts, a letter for you to present to potential sponsors is available as a PDF on the Eagles Website, as well as a receipt if this is requested. It is highly recommended that you send a formal thank you with a copy of our program, screenshot of our website or other evidence that business has received the represented promotion.

Additional Fundraising: At least annually, additional program or team fundraising will be necessary. We ask that you actively participate in these endeavors as they help provide for the program and keep our players fees low.

Section II Policies & Procedures

Health and Liability Insurance: All players are expected to carry personal insurance providing coverage should injury occur during practices or games. Parents, guardians, and players agree that the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program, as well as the facilities used for practices and games, will not be held responsible for any injuries. In the event your child is injured while playing/practicing or while traveling to/from one of our events, the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program does carry "Accident Medical & Dental Expenses" and "Accidental Death & Dismemberment". This is a supplemental policy which means you must file with your own health insurance policy first. If there are remaining expenses that your own will not cover, you can file a claim under the Lincoln Eagles Policy. Claims must be submitted within 30 days of first treatment. Those covered are players, coaches, managers, and volunteers of the team. In the event you would need to file a claim, you need to fill out the claim form.

Player Fees: Player fees will be set prior to each season based on the budget of the team in consideration of the operating expense of the program. All player fees may be paid directly or through fund raising opportunities (See Below) offered by the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program. Fees cover gym practice space rentals, referees, tournament fees, travel expenses and stipends for coaches, equipment, banquet, and other various operating costs. If for some reason a student athlete can't finish the season you can request a partial refund of players fees. This is based on the percentage of the season completed: Before December 1st = Eligible for 50% refund.

<u>Financial Hardship Assistance</u>: We do not want players fees to be the reason to not participate, so limited financial hardship assistance is available and is considered on a case-by-case basis, as funds are available. Please send an email to <u>Lincoln.EaglesBasketball@gmail.com</u> with the subject line "Financial Hardship Assistance", and provide the following information, 1) Explain your situation and why you need assistance, 2) How would you be willing to provide extra volunteer help to the program this year.

- A \$75 non-refundable player commitments deposit is due by the registration deadline (Approximately the first part of September) and will be applied to individual player fees.
- All player fees, less player commitment deposit and specific fundraising applied, is due by the first week of November. If player fees have not been paid prior to November, a \$50 Late Fee will be added to the player fee balance.

Other Possible Expenses to Players: In general, additional expenses beyond player fees may include: personal gym equipment, apparel, shoes, lodging, gas, and food for out of town games/tournaments are the responsibility of the player and/or family.

Guidance on Apparel, Hygiene, & Representing our program: One of the key components to the Lincoln Eagles program Vision statement is "pursuing excellence". This applies not only to our play on the court, but in how we present ourselves on and off the court (behavior, speech, dress/adornment, etc.). Everyone has different standards, and even the "same" standard can be applied very differently. It is

impossible for our program to anticipate and address that herein. However, we want our program to have an attitude consistent with Romans 14:13-23. Verse 13 captures our thinking on this very well:

"Therefore, let us stop passing judgment on one another. Instead, make up your mind not to put any stumbling block in the way of your brother or sister." Romans 14:13 NIV

Part of our commitment to "pursuing excellence" as a program is to provide for high quality and great looking uniforms which are refreshed/updated every 3 years. These should be kept in good repair, regularly washed, and kept stain free. Under shirts may be worn, but should be either black or white. Socks must always be worn. Consistent with standard basketball protocol, during competition jerseys must be tucked into shorts, and all jewelry must be removed. In the case of a recent ear piercing, please protect/cover appropriately. Headbands are acceptable but can't be "tie on" and should not be wider than 2 inches due to regulations. No "street shoes" are allowed on the court for practice or games. For practices we recommend clean, neatly fitting, and comfortable shorts and shirts. Practice Jerseys are provided to all players, please bring these to every practice and make sure they are washed regularly. In keeping with good sportsmanship and respect for teammates, coaches, and opponents we ask that student athletes practice good personal hygiene, including making sure body and clothes are clean and deodorant is applied.

As a program the Lincoln Eagles want to exemplify our Vision, Mission, and Values. While our presentation or physical appearance is an important part of that, nothing speaks to this more clearly than our overall attitude. As a program we ask you to pay proper attention to both.

Player Conduct and Involvement: Teaching commitment and responsibility is part of the intentional character-building process we hope student athletes learn by being a part of our program. Practices and games are not "optional" however we understand that circumstances arise that require student athletes to be absent from time to time. Involvement on teams outside of the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program during season play is not allowed unless approved by the Board of Directors.

Players are expected to:

- 1. Be on time for practices and games.
- 2. Contact their coach when they are unable to be at a practice or game.
- 3. Understand that excused absences are at the discretion of the coach.
- 4. Listen to instructions and follow the team rules as set out by this handbook and coaches.
- 5. Show respect and loyalty to the coaches, players, parents and leadership of Lincoln Eagles Basketball.
- 6. Be coachable willing to take direction, instruction, and discipline.
- 7. Demonstrate an enthusiasm for practices and playing the game.
- 8. Strive for excellence as a player, student and to show leadership.
- 9. Maintain the equipment issued to each player.

10. Not use any abusive, foul, degrading, disruptive, or complaining language, and always remain encouraging to those around the player.

- 11. Report all injuries to the coaching staff ASAP.
- 12. Refrain from misconduct, at any time which has potential negative impact on the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program's reputation or image.
- 13. Do your best to participate in team events and service projects

These expectations/rules must be maintained while the players are under the authority of the coaches and chaperones at any Program event.

Volunteering: In addition, players are expected to help if possible when the program is hosting games or a tournament. Many hands make light work, so the following functions should be assumed by players: set up, clean up and tear down, sweeping (in between games or at half time), collecting or disposing of trash, running the clock, doing the "book" (as determined to be age appropriate) running the admissions table, or other areas which won't cause fatigue or occur at a time which conflicts with a players team responsibilities. As stated in the Parent Involvement section of this handbook, "see a need fill a need" is our standard, and it applies equally to players. This is the players program. Programs and teams are most effective when players have "skin in the game". This happens when players are not waiting for coaches or parents to lead. Great teams and programs happen when the players themselves actively participate in setting the standard, enforcing the standard, and leading themselves and their teammates (including the day-to-day functions that make a program go). It is each player's responsibility to make sure they comply with this standard, and potentially reviewed by the AD, Board, Coaches, and Parents.

Parent Conduct: Parents/Guardians are expected:

1. To encourage and support the authority of the coaching staff, Board, and Athletic Director, and the Program in general.

2. To make every reasonable effort to have the player at all scheduled practices and games and fulfill their commitment to the team.

3. To treat coaches, fellow parents, game officials, players, and spectators with respect at all times, and to make sure all family members do the same.

4. To contact the Athletic Director, any Board member, or coach with any problems, concerns, or comments regarding the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program, and not spread it around. (Matt 18:15).
5. To make the coaches, Athletic Director or Board Member aware of any physical, mental, or emotional problems that their player may experience.

6. To abide by the guidelines set up for out-of-town travel, including but not limited to, insuring proper clothing and appropriate off-court conduct. Players will not be allowed to drive to out-of-town games.7. To support the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program by volunteering for the many needs of the program.

8. To make sure all spectators who are invited to any Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program function understand the expectations as they are written here and agree to abide by them.

9. To pay fees and other potential program fees by assigned due dates.

10. To acknowledge that their student has met eligibility requirements noted herein.

11. To provide correct contact and personal information to prevent miscommunications.

12. To encourage their player(s) to adhere to "Player Conduct & Involvement" noted above.

Drug/Alcohol/Tobacco Use: The Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program will maintain without exception a drug-free, alcohol-free, and tobacco-free environment for all players while participating in practices and games including travel time to and from away games. While participating, there is to be no form of drug, alcohol, or tobacco used by any of the players. The legal use of prescribed drugs is permitted, but players must make coaches and chaperones aware of the medicine(s) being taken.

Rules & Discipline: Rules govern almost every aspect of human life and conduct. Whatever the situation, rules are necessary to assure fairness and harmony. Rules guide our conduct, express mutual expectations, and help guarantee freedom from the arbitrary and irresponsible acts of others. Rules are expressed in both positive and negative terms; that is, in terms of what you can do, as well as what you cannot do. We realize that responsible people will have reasonable disagreements from time to time over what is consistent with the expectations of Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program and this Handbook.

When that occurs the Board of Directors will serve as the final arbitrator/interpreter of how the following applies to the situation at hand.

The Disciplinary Action Schedule below summarizes the rules/expectations of the Lincoln Eagles Basketball Program and sets out anticipated actions of the program in response to behavior inconsistent with our Vision, Mission, and Values. It is difficult to address every possible event or scenario, but the following represents the spirit with which the Lincoln Eagles Program will administer discipline with progressive escalation. The schedule that follows helps assure uniform communication and uniform administration throughout the program's operations, even though individual cases may require individual consideration by coaches, the Athletic Director, or Board.

Any warnings, suspensions, or dismissals given to a player will be immediately explained to the parents as well. See Disciplinary Action Schedule Below:
